Day 1



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16th Street Mall

Because of its identity as a "pedestrian" mall, the 16th Street Mall is walker-friendly with an abundance of trees and plazas. At only a mile long, it has plenty to occupy your day with — from outdoor cafés, shops, restaurants, and retail stores, to fantastic glass-lined skyscrapers and historic office buildings. Its promenade is beautifully adorned with red and gray granite, and it's conveniently located in the center of Downtown Denver.

In case you don't feel like walking, they offer a free gas-powered bus that takes you from one end to the other, giving you convenient access to its stores and eateries.



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Art District on Santa Fe

Santa Fe Drive area is known to be a hot spot for those interested in browsing through art galleries and possibly planning to purchase some art—prices range from as low as 30 dollars up to thousands, depending on how successful the artist is. The first Friday of each month turns the area into a kind of entertainment center with gallery doors wide open, street performers on every corner and food trucks lining the drive itself.



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Rocky Mountain Adventures

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Nearby Golden is home to the famous Coors Brewery, where visitors get tours and free samples. Rocky Mountain National Park, just 114 kilometers from Denver, features amazing wildlife, hiking trails, and spectacular vistas. Mount Evans Scenic Byway (96 kilometers from Denver) is the highest paved road in North America, winding its way to a 4,346-meter summit. And, come winter, Denver is the gateway to some of the world's best skiing and snow sports.





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Denver Botanic Gardens

The Denver Botanic Gardens and its satellite locations are a Shakespearean sonnet that come to life. Four gardens with four distinctive identities are available for leisure, education, or play. The gardens at York Street serve as a testament to Denver's Western heritage, the gardens at Chatfield possess a rustic peace, the Mount Goliath gardens offer subalpine, alpine, and mountain vistas of Denver while the Mordecai Children's Garden is a land of exploration for kids and families through the seasons.



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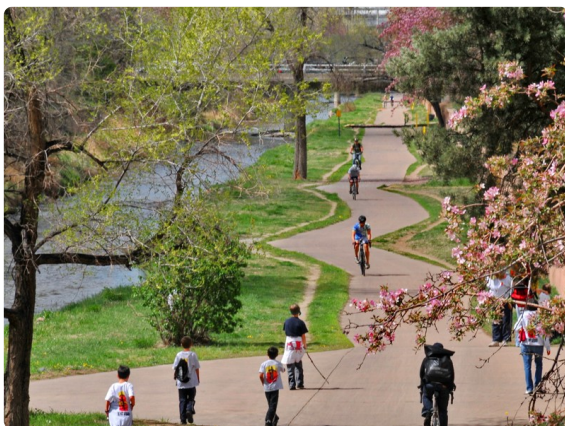
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Cherry Creek North

Denver, Colorado - The City

In the wake of the California Gold Rush, prospectors hoped to strike their own reserve of wealth and riches in the streams of the Rocky Mountains and the South Platte River. Today, citizens of Denver have riches worth far more than precious metal. They have a prosperous city inlaid in the horizons of prairie fields and the mighty Rockies mountainside.

As a part of America's pioneering history, Denver is riddled with historical elements. The Colorado Railroad Museum showcases the city's tenacity in constructing an entirely citizen-built rail system, which connected Denver to the transcontinental railroad. Remnants of the Wild West can be found in areas like the Buffalo Bill Museum and Grave, allowing visitors to step into the Old Western lifestyle. Other landmarks of esteem include the world's largest single producer of coins, the Denver Mint.

Denver is a city that generously caters to its citizens, boasting an array of parks, trails, gardens, museums, and districts that suit their diverse interests. Additionally, the Mile High City knows how to entertain its inhabitants and visitors alike, as evidenced by its status as the largest beer brewer in the United States.



Top Things to See and Do in Denver



Denver, Colorado - Do & See

As a city crafted among the natural wonders of the Rocky Mountains and High Plains, much of Denver's appeal resides in exploring its ethereal beauty. It possesses a rich cultural and geographical history, both of which are created via Denver's plethora of museums and natural trails.

Denver offers attractions for all ages: the Denver Museum of Nature & Science, with its dinosaur exhibits, Space Odyssey, a digital planetarium, and IMAX theater; the Denver Performing Arts Complex, home to 10 venues offering theater, opera, symphony, ballet, and Broadway touring shows; History Colorado Center, telling the stories of the past through people and places; Denver Botanic Gardens, a lush oasis in the middle of the city; the Denver Art Museum, with its acclaimed American Indian and Western art collections; and the Clyfford Still Museum, showcasing the work of this American abstract expressionist.



Mount Evans

Mount Evans Scenic Byway, Idaho Springs

Mount Evans is Denver's biggest natural attraction, drawing people from all over the country to scale its Scenic Byway and catch glimpses of everything from stunning wildlife to a wonderful view of the cityscape and skyline. Just 60 miles west of Denver, the Mount Evans Scenic Byway is nearly 9,000 feet of adrenaline-fueled elevation gain. It extends from the High Plains all the way to the Mount Evans summit—which lifts to a spectacular 14,000 feet. Native to Mount Evans are birds, mountain goats, Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep, marmots, and alpine wildflowers; three different hiking trails will give you the opportunity to see them: the Walter Pesman Trail, the Walter Pesman Alpine Garden Loop, and the Summit Trail.

Passport / Visa

Citizens of the Schengen countries, the United Kingdom, Ireland, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, Japan, South Korea, Taiwan, and the Kingdom of Brunei can visit the United States for up to 90 days without applying for a visa (as well as citizens of Andorra, Lichtenstein, Monaco and San Marino). Citizens of these countries must obtain an ESTA (Electronic System for Travel Authorization) before traveling. All other travelers must obtain a visa before visiting the United States. International travelers need a passport that is valid for at least 3 months after the end of their intended trip in order to enter the country.

Denver International Airport (DEN) is the primary airport servicing the Denver area, located 24.4 miles (39.9 kilometers) northeast of downtown Denver.

Ground transportation is available from the level 5 Jeppesen Terminal. SkyRide is a convenient and affordable bus service to and from Denver International Airport. Catch frequent SkyRide buses throughout the RTD service area at bus stops and at many Park-n-Rides. Buses run every day at 15-minute intervals, tickets may be purchased at RTD counters.

Other available transportation includes taxi services, rental car companies, hotel shuttles, public buses, commuter shuttles, luxury limousines, mountain carriers, and charter buses.
